

Spent Grains

We entered May with \$3,707.94 in the bank account. We received \$247 in income, including dues form 4 members. Expenses totaled \$224, leaving us with an ending balance for March of \$3,730.94.

Two people decided to immortalize their name by sponsoring a tap on the new club bar. We still have 7 taps available for sponsorship. For \$75, you can get your name engraved on a plate assigned to a tap. Your donation goes to cover hardware for that tap and the general construction of the bar. You can mail your check to me or see me at the June meeting.

We currently have 53 paid members, including 12 new members this year. If you haven't renewed your membership for 2010 yet, please send me a check or bring your dues to the June meeting. And let's welcome new member Adam Sever of Torrance. See you at the June meeting!

Finally, I discovered last month that changes in federal tax law now require all tax-exempt organizations to file a federal return each year. Since SBC is a small, hobby club, we were previously not required to file federal returns, and we didn't. But a side effect of not filing is that our tax identification number was deactivated. I filed

an extension for our federal return, and am in the process of reactivating our ID number. Hopefully that will be complete soon, and we will once again be a fully recognized tax-exempt organization.

Saturday was delightful. In the morning, we went to the Oakland zoo and saw giraffes, elephants, lions, tigers, zebras and a bunch of different birds. Next, on to Barney's Burgers in Berkeley (best in the east bay according to all the awards on the wall) to tune up for the real BBBBBB in August.

Then, we got to beer nirvana about 3:30 PM just ahead of the evening's crowd.

The Trappist Belgian & Specialty Beer Bar



The Trappist is a bar in Old Oakland that's been open for a couple of years. It was built new to look old with dark wood furniture, a high painted tin ceiling and black and white tile floors. It features 26 taps and more than 160 bottled beers. An autographed photo of Eddy Merckx, with his World Champion's jersey, is prominently displayed in the center of the front bar. Merckx is the Babe Ruth of professional cycling and is a living God in Belgium. It's fitting that he joins the celebration at the





Correct glasses were provided for each beer and service was elegant. The taps have a built in glass rinser (insert glass upside down and push button) and the head was properly leveled to the glass top. All this and it's only 5 ½ hours north!

Here's a <u>link</u> to construction pictures of the bar and <u>another</u> to the beer list which changes almost daily. Since the bar opened, more space has been acquired next door that has been turned into a "back bar" area to accommodate demand. Sam, Casey (aka Toby's parents) and I shared:

- Slaapmutsk Tripel Nightcap (very bitter for a Tripel)
- St Feuillian Tripel (closer to classic Westmalle)
- Firestone Walker Union Jack IPA (intense hop aroma and flavor)
- Rodenbach Classic (more like Duchess than R Grand Cru)
- Allagash Dubbel (high esters and phenols)
- Geants Goliath Tripel (very spicy)
- St Feuillien Saison (sweeter than DuPont)
- De Ranke Noir de Dottignies (spicy and malty)

Ethie watched Toby, who slept through the party.

Three of the newer craft breweries in the region have recently sponsored contests at their breweries. They are Black Market in Temecula,



Hanger 24 in Redlands



and Inland Empire in Riverside.



All are owned by home brewers, make great beer and promote home brewing to raise the visibility of their businesses. Try their beers when you have a chance and no, I don't get a steenkin' nickel for this blatant advertisement. Will we see a Strand Brewing Company contest in the future?



Last, a trend has appeared at the Best of Show panels I've done the past 12 months. The old cliché tells us to "finish your beer; there are sober people in China". This time I'm serious. Finish your beer! A remarkable number of beers that won flights at these eight contests were under attenuated and too sweet for their styles to be serious BOS contenders. Only 14% of the 80 beers in the BJCP Style Guidelines may correctly have high Final Gravities, above 1.020. Most are strong beers that have high Original Gravities and full bodies.

Here's what the BJCP Study Guide has to say about the topic; "Sweetness is a basic taste perceived most strongly at the tip of the tongue and is due to the presence of reducing sugars. High levels of residual sugars can result from a flocculent or low-attenuating yeast or poor yeast health linked to low Free Amino Nitrogen (FAN) levels or low levels of dissolved oxygen prior to pitching. High gravity wort, high dextrin content and the addition of lactose also play a role in determining the sweetness of the finished beer. The appropriate level is style-dependent, with higher levels desirable in most strong ales and lagers, and low levels in American light lagers and lambics". Undesired high FG and cloying sweetness are a real distraction. Help your yeast ferment completely to allow your beers to finish where they should.


