Foam at the Top

Wow, May was a busy month of beer drinking for me and now I'm looking forward to getting back to some more beer brewing! I hope everyone had as great a time as I did at The Southern California Homebrewers Festival at Lake Casitas. What a great time and the weather could not have been better! We had a good turnout of members, with about 25 or so showing up for the event. Most of us were camped pretty far away from the festival grounds in campground G this year, which made for a different, but equally as fun, experience. We had a great bonfire and bottle share on Friday night, after returning back from setting up the booth and the commercial pouring. On Saturday, we had all 22 taps pouring and then some. Our keg of the Cabernet Barrel Aged Sour Ale was an especially huge hit.

The May meeting had a good turnout, including some new faces, and we filled one of my 5 gal whiskey barrels I mentioned in last month's Dregs with half of the Old Ale that we brewed at the Club Brew at Chad Hazen's in

February. You can see it on display at SBBS. I'm currently working on filling the other 3. On the agenda to brew for them are an IRS, American Barley Wine, and a Tripel.

A few weekends later, I hosted a birthday party and bottle share on my roof deck in Hermosa and several members attended. Check out some of the bottles we opened.

I also had some of the left over kegs from Ojai and a keg of Monkish Feminist (Tripel with Hibiscus) on tap. I love to support the local South Bay Breweries. There are now 2 breweries in Torrance (Strand and Monkish) with plans for Dude's Brewing Co. and possibly one other to open this year. There is also El Segundo Brewing. So the South Bay, and especially Torrance, is quickly becoming quite the craft beer destination. Speaking of which, I'd like us to host some social events at all of their taprooms and also the newly re-opened Rock & Brews soon. I'll get our events coordinator working on that.

Now that Ojai is behind us, there is no time to relax. We have lots of events and opportunities coming up in the very near future to get our name out there and share our great beer. But it's going to require a lot of hard work participation, and, most importantly, a lot of brewing from everyone.

First of all, I want to remind everyone that the tasting for the 2nd round of our Iron Brewer Competition will be held at the June Meeting on 6/13. The ingredients are Oats, Nugget Hops, and Sweet Orange Peel. That's only a week and a half away, so hopefully everyone has already brewed. If not, there *may* still be time to

squeeze in a session strength beer with some quick fermenting yeast and an overnight force carbonate. It's not easy (or recommended), but I've actually turned around one or two beers from grain to glass in about 10 days, when in a pinch. Mild style ales, with flocculate English yeast, or wheat beers can work well if attempting this.

Next on the agenda, we have been invited to participate in the Manhattan Beach Young Professionals SummerFest event on Saturday July 14th from 3-6 PM. There will be "Live bands, over 20 breweries, up and coming home brewers, local restaurants, amazing food trucks...all for a good cause." This is a great opportunity to pour our homebrews for the general local population, alongside commercial breweries. This will be great advertisement for the club and just plain cool. It also cannot hurt our PBC sponsorship effort. Plus, the event is a fundraiser for charity. I think they are still taking applications and deciding which charity, but in the past they have supported "We Can, Pediatric Brain Tumor Network" and "Mychal's Learning Place, an after school program." More details to come, but I would like us to have kegs of at least 2-3 really good homebrews to pour for this. We'll want to be selective, since we'll be pouring for the general public and alongside the pros. We need to start brewing for this now!

Then, right on the heels of the SummerFest, The OC Fair is looking to promote craft beer and homebrewing this year, by having exhibits about beer and the brewing process where people can answer questions and/or a live brewing demo in the craftsman space. The culinary arts exhibit coordinator has contacted me to see if we are interested in putting on one of these exhibits and/or demos and I said we were. So we are looking for volunteers. The dates available are Sat July 14, July 15, Sunday July 22, Sat July 28, Sun. July 29, and Sun Aug 5. Please let me know if you can support one of these dates.

Also, we have traditionally done 2 club events during the summer – The Summer Party and the BBBBBBB Beer Bar Bike tour of the South Bay. There is a lot going on, so we're looking for 2 people to step up and take charge of the planning of these events

Finally, as you all know, we have the PBC quickly approaching in just under 4 months!!! The sponsorship effort is underway, but there is a lot of other work to help out with and especially as we get a little closer to the event there will be a lot of logistics to work out. I

would like for everyone to make it a personal goal this year to submit at least one entry to the PBC and represent the club.

So you can see we really have our work cut out for us, but I think we can pull it all off if we get good participation from everyone. The guys at the South Bay Brewing Supply are also going to help us out with some of these events. If we have to prioritize things, I would like to see the focus in this order PBC -> SummerFest -> OC fair -> Summer Party -> BBBBB. We'll be scheduling some more club brews soon to yield some beer for these events and I hope everyone will also brew on their own. I'm actually in the process of moving to a new place in South Redondo, where I will have a lot more room, so hopefully I can host a club brew soon, once I'm up and running there. Ok everyone get to work and get brewing!

Next Saturday appears to be a busy day for beer events.

Firestone Walker will be hosting their Invitational Beer Festival in Paso Robles, CA. Last year's was outstanding, and this year seems to be continuing the tradition. This festival in particular seems somewhat unique in that there are several well-regarded breweries from other parts of the country who pour beers which you simply cannot find on the West Coast normally. Look out for excellent craft beer from the likes of Bell's, Founders, Three Floyds, Odell, and many more. And that's not even covering the excellent food and live music that will be on-hand as well.
