April 29th and 30th - 25th Southern California Homebrewers Festival

The California Homebrewers Association has announced that the 25th Southern California Homebrewers Festival will be held at the Vail Lake Resort, Temecula, CA on April 29th and 30th. 2016. This will be an extraordinary event. Thus far, 37 homebrewers' clubs have signed up to serve homebrew to an expected 2,000 festival attendees. The Strand Homebrewers Club will be setting up our bar at the festival and serving "the best damn beer." The festival features commercial beer tastings, educational speakers, music, a raffle with great prizes, a "Bragging Rights Only" competition, and homebrew. lots of homebrew.

In order to attend the SCHF you must be a member of the California Homebrewers Association. CHA memberships go on sale December 1st for \$10. Membership benefits include discounts to Southern California breweries and home brew shops.

Registration for the SCHF begins on January 1st, 2016. The initial cost will be \$35, but

increases to \$40 on February 1st, and then increases again to \$45 on March 1st. Registration closes on April 24th. If you volunteer to help out the CHA during the festival, you can earn free admission.



Brewery Safety

I use a small chest freezer with a temperature controller as a fermentation chamber. I noticed that lifting a carboy full of wort in and out of the chest freezer, even with the carboy in a Brew Hauler harness, was hard on my back. Of course I did't do anything about it until I strained my back. Man you can't do much of anything with a back injury. So while I healed I figured out a method of lifting that would not put so much stress on my back. I purchased a "Hang 'Em High Hoist" from the Brew In A Bag website. I installed an eye hook above the fermentation chamber and voilà!, I can now lift carboys in and out of the chamber without straining my back.

This worked so well that I looked for other places that lifting put a strain on my back. I realized that when I filled kettles with water in the sink next to the fermentation chamber, I was putting stress on my back lifting the kettles out of the sink. I installed another eye hook above the sink so that I can use the hoist there too.

I have come to the conclusion that pain is the mother of all invention.

Starting a Hop Farm Rick Wirsing, Dregs Editor

Penny and I have friends, Linda and Ken Reed, that retired and settled in the Paso Robles area. While they were still working for a living, they bought and began developing a property located somewhere near San Miguel, CA. First they planted grape vines and later built a house. They have had some success making wine out of their grapes, having won medals in local competitions. As you can imagine, the competition is pretty stiff around Paso Robles. There are now more than 200 commercial wineries in the area.

Having an interest in beer and a little experience in homebrewing, Linda and Ken decided to begin growing hops. So, in 2011 they established <u>Paso Hops</u> and the Skip Hop Farm to bring "organic, sustainable principles to the art of hop growing" and "to help home brewers enhance their craft." They chose to plant cascade hop rizomes. Because they do everything by hand, they needed a structure to support the hop bines, but that would also lower the bines so as to make it easy to harvest the hops. They built a prototype structure that is comprised of a vertical post that supports lines upon which the bines grow. The lines can be raised and lowered with the use of a winch.




The hop growing structure at the Skip Hop Farm.


What We Stand For
